North Carolina Law (governing the ESA+ Program)





- North Carolina lawmakers established the ESA+ Scholarship Program.
- Our state agency, the North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority (NCSEAA), is charged with administering ESA+.
- State law requires that our agency confirm a student's Continuing Eligibility for ESA+ at least every three years.

#### Initial Eligibility vs Continuing Eligibility

Initial Eligibility: You may remember that for the ESA+ new student application, you had to provide the public school Eligibility Determination to document your student's disability.

#### **Continuing Eligibility:**

- Current students
- Update the student's documentation of a disability
- Most students have 2 options
- Every 3 years from the date of the documentation currently on file with ESA+





Calculate the Three Years





# What is your student's current documentation date?

- Pay attention to the year (not the month or day).
- 1. Add 3 to the year.
- If the current date is 2023: 2023 + 3 = 2026
- 2. Start the process in the spring of 2026.
- 3. As of January 1, 2027, the documentation is outdated, and the student is no longer eligible for ESA+.








#### What happens if the Continuing Eligibility

#### requirement is not met by January 1?

- ESA+ won't disburse spring funds
- Funds in ClassWallet are forfeited
- The student can't renew for the next year







Two Options (for most students)





#### Continuing Eligibility: How?

(1) Return to the public school for a reevaluation via the IEP team process

OR


(2) Have a psychologist or psychiatrist sign the Continuing Eligibility Form\*

\* There are students who can't use this option

#### Option 1: what to submit

## Eligibility Determination from a North Carolina public school IEP team

- Contact your local public school.
- Request a re-evaluation.
- A full IEP is not required.
- Seek an updated Eligibility Determination.



## Public School Eligibility Determination

#### **Accepted**

- Eligibility Determination issued by a North Carolina public school IEP team
- Eligibility Determination issued by a Department of Defense School located in North Carolina
- Dated within the last 3 years



## Not Accepted



- Other IEP documentation: prior written notice, annual goals, progress reports
- 504 plans
- Student Aptitude or Achievement Tests
- Letter from doctor or other professional
- Private psychological assessment





#### **Continuing Eligibility form**

One of the following processes must document continuing eligibility for the student every three years for the student to remain eligible for one the program. The program does not require medical records or educational test results; however, families must submit one of the two documents outlined below 1. The local public school system assesses the stude t to determine if the student continues to be a child with a disability. The public school that verifies the outcome via the Eligibility To be completed by Student Name (printed) I certify that I have reviewed appropriate medical and educational records for the student named above. I further certify that the education and related services received by the student in the nonpublic school setting have improved the child's educational performance, and that the child will continue to benefit from placement in the nonpublic school setting. I certify that I am a psychologist with a school psychology focus or a psychiatrist, licensed to practice in North Carolina. I further certify that I have the knowledge and expertise to make the assessment and render the foregoing certification. I am licensed and in good standing with the North Carolina agency governing my profession. Psychologist/Psychiatrist name (printed)

#### Option 2: what to submit

Form signed by a North Carolina licensed
 psychiatrist OR by a North Carolina licensed
 psychologist with a school psychology focus

 The cost of a psychiatrist or psychologist is an acceptable use of ESA+ funds if the provider is enrolled with SEAA and completes the Continuing Eligibility Form while providing a therapeutic service.



Exceptions

(Which students have only one option for Continuing Eligibility?)






#### Exception

Students whose primary or only area of disability is **Developmental Delay**.

These students must be re-evaluated by a North Carolina public school to maintain eligibility for the ESA+ scholarship.








#### Exception

Students whose parents want to **update the area of disability** (to change the ESA+ award level).

Only the North Carolina public school IEP Eligibility Determination can document a change in the area of disability.

#### Process

#### FIRST:

Contact your local public school and request a re-evaluation. Explain that you need an Eligibility Determination. You don't need a full IEP.

#### OR

Schedule an appointment with a North Carolina licensed psychologist or psychiatrist. Share the Continuing Eligibility Form that you will ask them to sign.

#### THEN:

Upload the Eligibility Determination *OR* Continuing Eligibility Form to MyPortal.





# How to Upload a Document to MyPortal

- 1. Sign on to MyPortal.
- 2. Look for the To Do list.
- 3. Look for the task with the link: "Continuing Eligibility Information".
- 4. Submit the document as ONE Word or PDF file.

**Tip**: Don't email your document. Staff will only have to ask you to upload to MyPortal.









## Submitting a Document Off-Cycle

Sometimes a parent has a document ready to submit *before* the upload link is available in MyPortal.

#### Here's how it works

The three-year cycle begins with the date of the most recent IEP Eligibility Determination or previous Continuing Eligibility date on file with SEAA. You will receive email reminders in MyPortal when it is time to complete the re-evaluation.
